\$758,295 Total admissions revenue, from fees paid by nonresident visitors and collected by SFBGS for the City and County of San Francisco/ Recreation and Park Department

312,982 Visitors to the Garden — a 56 percent increase since 2010

40,100 Hours contributed by volunteers to virtually every aspect of the Garden's operations

28,177 Volumes plus 360 current plant and garden periodicals in the Helen Crocker Russell Library of Horticulture, Northern California's most comprehensive horticultural collection*

25,000 Plant propagations (estimated) by staff and volunteers, with many available to the public for purchase

12,836 Children interacting with nature through SFBGS school-year, summer and family programs: over 40 percent growth in children served since 2010

8,372 Different kinds of plants thriving in the Garden, including 5,618 species, of which 30 percent were wild-collected and more than 300 are rare and endangered*

2,183 Households, representing individuals, couples and families from San Francisco, the Bay Area and beyond who support the Garden through their memberships

1,047 Corporate, school and service organization volunteers doing one-time group projects

472 Free daily docent-led tours, along with 188 docent-staffed weekend interpretation stations, where visitors can learn more about particular collections

483 Regular volunteers participating throughout the year

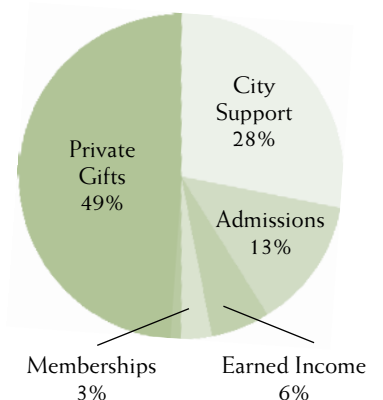
San Francisco Botanical Garden is a place of beauty, learning and inspiration for more than 300,000 visitors annually. Celebrating its 75th anniversary in 2015, the Garden is renowned for its significant and diverse plant collections. It is possible to travel the world within the Garden's 55 acres. No other institution provides the same opportunity to experience nature *in* nature, right in the heart of our city.

Today it is estimated that more than a third of the world's plant biodiversity is threatened or faces extinction in the wild. Many botanical gardens, including ours, have become a refuge for plants that no longer can be found in their native habitats. The Garden is particularly well-suited for this important conservation role because so many different kinds of plants can thrive in San Francisco's unique topography and climate.

SFBGS is proud to partner with the San Francisco Recreation and Park Department to make our Garden such a cherished part of the cultural fabric of our community. We thank you—our donors, members, visitors, volunteers and the people of San Francisco—for your support.

WHO PAYS FOR THE GARDEN

With limited public funding, especially in recent years, private support from our community is more crucial than ever. In the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013, combining the work of SFBGS and the Department, it cost \$4.8 million to operate the Garden. More than 70 percent of the Garden's financial support came from SFBGS's donors and members and from the Garden's visitors.

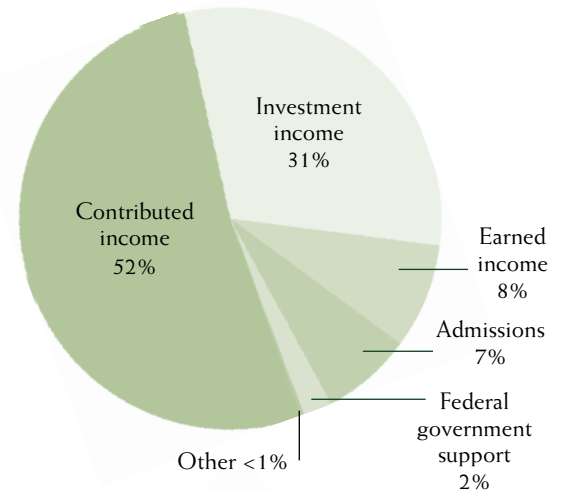

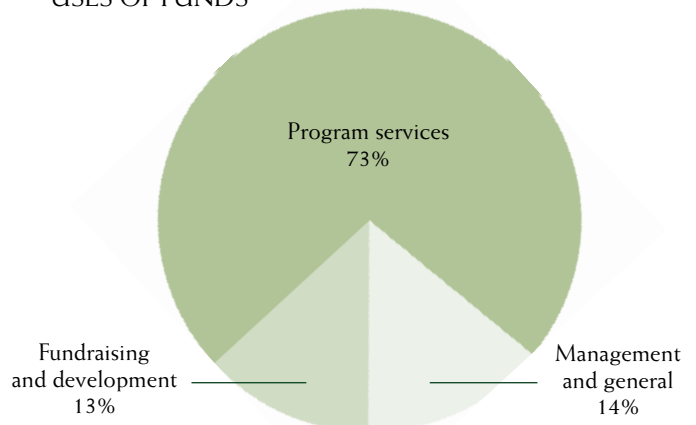
